

How do I take the FinalExam?

The FinalExam is a 'traditional' test -- i.e. in class, on paper.

What is on the FinalExam?

The FinalExam is comprehensive, i.e. covers all material of the course (including material knowledge for doing the labs). The reading material for the exam is as outlined under 'Course Content' on the main 1520 web site.

Would all sections of 1520 have the same FinalExam?

How long is the exam? (i.e. what is the exam's duration)

The time allowed to do the exam is maximum of 3 hours (180 minutes).

Is the exam 'open-book'?

FinalExam is closed-book¬es. In case that some questions are deemed to require 'open notes', then those notes etc will be provided as part of the exam.

Can I use any computing or calculating device during the exam?

What if I miss the exam?

(from the registrar's office web site)

The April 2012 examination period is from **Wednesday**, **April 4 to Friday**, **April 20**, **2012** inclusive. It is your responsibility as a student to ensure that you are available to sit for examinations during the entire exam period for the term corresponding to your course.

We strongly recommend that you do not make any travel arrangements prior to the end of the term's examination schedule.

Unfortunately, there cannot be out-of-schedule exams during the exam period, before or after the normally scheduled exam date. In case that you missed the exam, please

provide evidence of the situation¹ as soon as possible after the exam²; your evidence will be reviewed and then it is possible that you will have the opportunity to petition for a deferred exam. Petitions for deferred exams are normally submitted to the Faculty office ...please inquire at the department main office for details and also consult the Registrar's office web site. In such cases please note that if your petition is approved (something for which there can be no guarantee) then you would take a deferred exam at a time unknown at this point. Such times have been known to possibly be as much as one term apart from the current term or even a year apart.
