

FX – Final Exam

What is FX?

FX is the final exam for this course.

When?

Apr 10 (Tuesday). Start 7 pm.

Where is it?

(please verify the location, day and time with the registrar web site).

How do I take the exam?

FX is a 'traditional' test -- i.e. in class, on paper.

What is on the FX?

The final exam is comprehensive, i.e. covers all the material of the course.

What is the format of the FX?

Similar to the format of the MT.

Is the FX 'open-book'?

FX is closed-book¬es. In case that some questions are deemed to require 'open notes', then those notes etc will be provided as part of the test.

Can I use any computing or calculating device during the test?

No. (this includes calculators, smartphones, tablets, netbooks, ultrabooks, notebooks, etc.)

The April 2012 examination period is from **Wednesday, April 4 to Friday, April 20, 2012** inclusive. It is your responsibility as a student to ensure that you are available to sit for examinations during the entire exam period for the term corresponding to your course.

We strongly recommend that you do not make any travel arrangements prior to the end of the term's examination schedule.

What if I get some kind of emergency or I cannot take the exam?

Unfortunately, there cannot be out-of-schedule exams during the exam period, before or after the normally scheduled exam date. In case that you missed the exam, please provide evidence of the situation as soon as possible¹; your evidence will be reviewed and then it is possible that you will have the opportunity to petition for a deferred exam. Petitions for deferred exams are normally submitted to the Faculty office ...please inquire at the department main office for details and also consult the Registrar's office web site. In such cases please note that if your petition is approved (something for which there can be no guarantee) then you would take a deferred exam at a time unknown at this point. Such times have been known to be as much as one term apart from the current term or even a year apart.
