WHAT IS TURNITIN?	Turnitin is a comprehensive plagiarism prevention system that allows you to quickly check your students work. Turnitin Digital Assessment Suite includes Gradebook, a flexible online grading system, and Peer Review, an area where students can review each other's work. www.turnitin.com	
HOW DOES IT WORK?	Every paper submitted to Turnitin is checked against a database of current and archived internet content, as well as a comprehensive list of millions of previously submitted student papers. The papers are returned in the form of an originality report that identifies the cause of plagiarism so that educators can address and solve the problem. Turnitin can be used early in the writing process so that students can submit rough drafts and identify early problems with plagiarism or paraphrasing. Teachers can use Turnitin to teach students about academic honesty and improve writing skills. Grademark can be used to track progress over the school year and cut down the time it takes to mark papers.
