Dahdaleh Global Health Graduate Scholarship

The Dahdaleh Global Health Graduate Scholarship (DGHGS) program seeks to attract and train the leading global health researchers of tomorrow. The scholarship provides annual financial support to high-calibre York University graduate students who demonstrate excellence or promise of excellence in research. It is intended to support their scholarly and creative professional activities relevant to the Dahdaleh Institute's three research themes.

Preference will be given to those under the supervision of a Dahdaleh Institute Faculty Fellow (see https://www.yorku.ca/dighr/people/).

Annual scholarships are available to domestic and international students registered as full-time graduate students at York University in one of the Institute's participating Faculties (Education; Environmental and Urban Change; Health; Lassonde School of Engineering; Liberal Arts & Professional Studies; Osgoode Hall Law School; School of Arts, Media, Performance & Design; Science).

The DGHGS provides funding in addition to the standard York University graduate student support package. The scholarship may be granted annually for up to four years and is based on an annual application and performance review.

The DGHGS is administered by the Dahdaleh Institute in collaboration with the Office of Student Financial Services and the Faculty of Graduate Studies.



Award Details

Description

The Dahdaleh Global Health Graduate Scholarship was created to attract exceptional incoming and continuing domestic and international graduate research students to the Dahdaleh Institute for Global Health Research. These scholarships will support graduate research and related scholarly and creative activities in line with the three themes of the Institute (planetary health, global health and humanitarianism, and global health foresighting). The scholarship will be granted annually to graduate students who demonstrate outstanding academic achievement in global health research.

Based on the availability of funds and the excellence and needs of applicants, annual scholarships for individual students will range from \$5,000 to \$25,000 CAD. Scholarship recipients will:

- be named "Dahdaleh Global Health Graduate Scholars" at the Dahdaleh Institute;
- attend and participate in the Dahdaleh Institute's weekly global health graduate seminars:
- present their work once in the Fall and once in the Winter term as part of the Dahdaleh Institute Annual Global Health Graduate Scholars Symposium and the Dahdaleh Institute Global Health Seminar Series;
- receive occasional invitations to participate in workshops and special events at the Dahdaleh Institute; and
- have access to the Dahdaleh Institute open workspace.

The scholarships will be granted to new or returning students based on research excellence or promise of excellence, and applications will be evaluated using the student's past performance and potential in their graduate program.

The scholarships will be adjudicated by the Dahdaleh Global Health Research Scholarship Committee based on the following evaluation criteria: a) academic excellence; b) research potential; c) excellence of the research proposed; and d) existing and potential innovation, leadership, and initiative.



Eligibility

The scholarship will be awarded to master's or doctoral students entering or continuing in a graduate program in the following Faculties at York University:

- School of the Arts, Media, Performance & Design
- Education
- Environmental and Urban Change
- Health
- Lassonde School of Engineering
- Liberal Arts & Professional Studies
- Osgoode Hall Law School
- Science

To be eligible, the student will:

- have applied or be in the process of applying for full-time admission to an eligible graduate program at York University or be enrolled in an eligible graduate program with full-time* status at York University
- plan to conduct global health research that aligns with the Dahdaleh Institute's mandate and three thematic areas

*Part-time status is only allowed if the program automatically shifts the student into part-time status once they complete their courses. The student agrees to work on their thesis/project/dissertation on a full-time basis.

Preference will be given to applicants endorsed by an existing or anticipated Dahdaleh Institute Faculty Fellow, who would become the applicant's graduate research supervisor.

The scholarship does not support coursework-only master's programs. Please do not apply for the DGHGS if your master's graduate program does not require a research proposal or statement of research interest as part of the application.

Value

The value and number of award(s) in any given year will depend on the availability of funding, the number of recipients selected, the year of study of the application, and other factors.

Range: \$5,000 to \$25,000 CAD (renewable*)

*Renewed funding is limited to the expected program completion period (one or two years for a master's degree and up to four years for a doctoral program, to a maximum of 48 months including any previous DGHGS Master's Awards).



Application Process

Application packages must include (.pdf files only):

- 1. Please attach a STATEMENT OF PURPOSE to the DGHGS Committee describing how or why your graduate research is relevant to one of the three research themes of the Dahdaleh Institute for Global Health Research. This statement should should be a maximum of two single spaced pages; and it should introduce yourself and describe your proposed masters or doctoral research plan and indicate how your graduate research is relevant to one of the three research themes of the Dahdaleh Institute for Global Health Research.
- 2. Please attach your updated certified TRANSCRIPTS.
- 3. Please attach your up-to-date academic CV.
- 4. Please attach a LETTER OF SUPPORT (not a letter of reference) from the York faculty member who is supervising your research or who has agreed to supervise your research if you are admitted to York University.
- 5. Please attach a LETTER (not a letter of reference) from your (proposed or current) York graduate program director which confirms:
 - a. your application status; or
 - b. your admissions offer with all sources of funding from the graduate program listed; or
 - c. that your admissions offer is conditional upon secured funding (which may include a Dahdaleh Global Health Graduate Scholarship); or
 - d. that confirms your ongoing continuing graduate student status, in good standing.
- 6. Please attach an itemized FINANCIAL BUDGET (<u>using this template</u>) detailing all your anticipated income and expenses for next year (including all financial support from external sources, the University, your Faculty and Department, income related to teaching, and fee waivers, etc..).

Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Deadline(s)

The application deadline for domestic and international applicants is 23:59 ET on the second Friday in January.



Evaluation Criteria

Scholarship applications will be evaluated according to the following criteria and weighting:

Expectations of Scholarship Recipients

Successful applicants will:

- maintain full-time student status:
- be named as a Dahdaleh Global Health Graduate Scholar at the Dahdaleh Institute:
- have access to the Dahdaleh Institute open workspace for graduate students;
- attend and participate in the Dahdaleh Institute's weekly Global Health seminars;
- present and lead one seminar in the Fall term and another in the Winter term at the Current Dahdaleh Institute Global Health Research in Progress Seminar Series;
- will not accept any teaching assistantship (TA) or graduate assistantship (GA) positions;
- apply for external funding (e.g., Vanier, CIHR, NSERC, SSHRC, OGS);
- report all funding you receive from within and outside the University upon notification of any additional funding;
- submit an annual progress report and the appropriate documentation if applying for an annual renewal (see Renewability, below); and
- write a thank you letter to the Dahdaleh Foundation.

Renewability

The DGHGS may be granted annually for up to the expected minimum graduate program completion period (3 or 6 terms [1 or 2 academic years] for master's programs; 12 academic terms [4 academic years] for PhD programs) to a maximum of 48 months, including any previous DGHGS Master's Awards. Renewals are based on an annual renewal application and performance review.

Renewal applications are due by 23:59 EST on the first **Friday in June**, and must be submitted using the "Dahdaleh Global Health Graduate Scholarship Renewal Application Form" Machform here: http://go.yorku.ca/renew-di-scholarship.

Applications for DGHGS renewal must include the following attachments (.pdf files only):

- 1. a letter from the student to the DGHGS Committee describing their progress in their graduate program and why they are eligible for renewal;
- 2. a letter of support from the student's graduate research supervisor;
- 3. the student's most recent York academic transcript;
- 4. a statement from the Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS) detailing all financial or scholarship support, income related to teaching, and/or fee waivers;
- 5. a letter of support from the student's graduate program director.
