Admission Requirements

- Have an undergraduate degree with a specialization in French (BA Honors in French) awarded by a recognized university or a diploma deemed equivalent by the admissions committee.
- Have obtained a general average of B in the first cycle and B+ in French courses, or the approval of the director. In certain cases, an entrance exam may be required.
- Students must have an excellent close-to-native written proficiency in French
