Founded in 1973, York's Graduate Program in Social and Political Thought (SPTH) undertakes to encourage, develop and advance the analysis of social and political ideas with the aim of integrating intellectual interests common to the humanities and social sciences. The Program is not associated with any particular school of thought, and stresses both historical and systematic study of social and political ideas.

- Major Research Project, (3 terms), Part-time available

Admission Requirements

- › Graduates with a four-year degree in a field of study relevant to pursuing graduate work in social and political thought from a recognized Canadian or United States university, or an honors degree from another recognized university, and with at least a B+ average in the last two years of study, are considered for admission as candidates for the MA degree.
