### Details of Degree

- Coursework Only OR Major Research Project OR Thesis, (6 terms) Part-time available

### Admission Requirements

- A. An Honours BA (i.e., four-year degree) or equivalent in Translation with a minimum of a "B" average in the last two years of full-time equivalent study (specific courses required; please see website) OR
- An honours degree or equivalent in another discipline, with a minimum of a "B" average in the last two years of full-time equivalent study PLUS an average of "B" in the Qualifying Program. AND
- B. Demonstrated competence, to the satisfaction of the Admissions Committee, in two languages, one of which must be English. AND
- C. All applicants except graduates from Canadian translation programs must write and pass an Entrance Examination.
