INDIVIDUAL RESEARCH PROJECT

Faculty of Health – York University Guidelines

Course Description:

Students arrange to complete an individual research project with a full-time faculty member in the Psychology Department, Faculty of Health. This course allows students to obtain first-hand research experience in a professor's area of research expertise. Students may complete one 6.00 credit or two 3.00 credit Individual Research Project courses in each academic year, to a maximum of 12.00 credits in total. After securing a supervisor, students should obtain an application form from the Department of Psychology and complete it in consultation with the supervisor.

- Minimum of 54 credits earned

Procedure for Enrolment:

Students should first ensure they have met all the prerequisites. Then they should (a) complete and sign this application with their supervisor, and (b) provide a copy for themselves, their supervisor. Following which <u>upload your completed application</u>.

An expanded description of the Individual Research Project should accompany the application form. **The description should be at least 150 words**. It should be as concrete as possible and should clearly indicate the goals of the research and both the obligations of the student and the obligations of the professor. This description will serve as a combination of course description and teacher-student contract.

Upon completion of this course, students should be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate in-depth knowledge of selected IRP topic(s).
- 2. Critically evaluate, synthesize and resolve conflicting results.
- 3. Articulate trends in selected topic(s).
- 4. Locate research articles and show critical thinking about research findings in selected topic(s).
- 5. Express knowledge about selected topic(s) in written form.
- 6. Engage in evidence-based dialogue with course director.
- 7. Demonstrate autonomous application of knowledge and skills.

Expectations:

- 1. The description should be concrete and explicit and a minimum of 150 words.
- 2. All IRP courses must include a written component.
- 3. The application must specify a calendar date when it is due in the evaluation section of the Application Form
- 4. Dates of discussion meetings should be specified.
- 5. The student should keep a copy of this Agreement Form and expanded description
