1. Chair's remarks

A. Moore welcomed members and explained how the meeting would be conducted in a hybrid setting.

2. Business Arising from the Minutes

There was no business arising from the minutes.

3. Dean's Remarks

Dean Peters welcomed Council members and noted that although the labour disruption has ended, there is still lots of work to be done during the remediation period. He reiterated his appreciation for the continued support during this time.

Dean Peters addressed the recent announcement of the School of Medicine. He indicated that he would take time over the summer months to consult with the schools and departments to gather information on how to proceed with recommendations. Since there will be significant differences in how the School of Medicine will be structured at York compared to other institutions, consultation will be critical.

Dean Peters thanked the Working Group on Individual and System Racism (WGISR) and the Sub-committee for DEDI for their hard work on the reports and implementation strategies. He noted that the work completed by both groups was thoughtful, aspirational, and ambitious. Dean Peters noted the alignment of the action plan with the Faculty of Health strategic plan and acknowledged how the goals and objectives complement each other. Within the context of the

action framework, he saw the role of the Dean to advocate for ideas and actions at the university level and to influence policies that will represent the collective interest.

Dean Peters finished his remarks with kudos and acknowledgements.

- **4.** Report of the Executive and Planning Committee R. Bishop provided the report.
- R. Bishop motioned, seconded by A. Belcastro that summer authority be conferred to the Executive and Planning Committee until the first meeting of Council in Fall 2024. The motion carried.
- R. Bishop notified Council that the Student Senator election process was administered in accordance with the Rules & Procedures of Faculty Council. The newly elected Faculty of Health Student Senator is James Ehiagwina and the returning student senator is Aila Narimani.

There was a call for nominations for the remaining 2024-2025 position vacancies including: Vice Chair of Council, at-large member of the Executive & Planning Committee, Faculty of Health Senators and Faculty of Health APPRC representative.

C. Ardern, School of Kinesiology & Health Science and M. Morrow were acclaimed as Faculty of Health Senators.

M. Herbert, School of Kinesiology & Health Science was elected as the Faculty of Health APPRC representative.

Nominations and/or expressions of interest for the remaining Council vacancies can be made to K. Hetherington. The positions will remain vacant until filled.

M. Morrow, C. Murray and S. Cheung were invited to provide a presentation on the Advocacy Framework and Action Plan from the Sub-committee on Decolonizing, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion. The presentation included context for the sub-committee, its membership and mandate. The presenters provided insight on the organization and structure of the report with a specific focus on implementation actions.

M. Herbert motioned, seconded by L. Sergio that the Faculty of Health create a Faculty of Health Standing Committee of Council on Decolonizing, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion. The motion carried.

APPRC reported on application and enrolment data projections for the Markham campus and the preliminary planning for the School of Medicine.

Report of the Petitions Committee of the Faculty of Health Council September 2024

ITEM FOR INFORMATION:

Year End Report 2023-2024

Committee members review material via eClass and note individual decisions prior to weekly meetings, where final decisions are confirmed. Since March 2020, all Committee meetings have been facilitated using Zoom Conferencing to accommodate the remote working conditions. In 2022, the committee has been offering the opportunity for hybrid meetings to accommodate members who preferred to attend the meeting in-person and those who preferred to attend virtually.

Beginning in 2020, the Petitions Faculty Council Report is presented at the September council meeting and analyzes trends and statistics for the entire term from July 1 to June 30. Prior to 2020, the Petitions Faculty Council Reports were presented at the May council meetings and reviewed the trends and statistics from July to April. The 2024 report will continue to review the trends and statistics for the entire 2023-24 term from July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, while comparing it to trends within the same timeframe during the 2022-23 term. For a long-term view on petitions, the report will also present a summary chart of number comparisons during the July – June period spanning from 2017-2023.

In 2023–2024, a total of 892 requests were adjudicated in the timeframe of July 1, 2023– June 30, 2024. By comparison, in 2022-2023, a total of 962 requests were adjudicated in the same timeframe. This represents a 7.3% overall decrease in petitions from last year. Similarly, the petitions committee saw a 13.51% decrease in late withdrawal petitions from last year. Late withdrawal petitions are the most common petitions and the trends for this petition request directly align with the overall trend of an increase in petition submissions. It is possible that the decrease in the number of late withdrawal petitions was a result of the accommodations provided by Senate/Senate Executive to students following the CUPE 3903 labour disruption.

Petitions to waive academic decisions in 2023-2024 decreased by a total of 15 (equivalent to 9.4% decrease) compared to 2022-2023 trends. These petitions include requests for: waiver of required withdrawal, waiver of debarment regulations and waiver of Honours standing regulations. Again, it is possible that this decrease can be attributed to the accommodations provided to students by Senate/Senate Executive following the CUPE 3903 labour disruption.

Requests for the pass/fail option have returned to pre-pandemic submission levels with an increase by a total of 11 (equivalent to 61% increase) in 2023-2024. Similarly, requests for waivers are also seeing relatively consistent submissions with minor fluctuations in these categories. The moderate increase in these types of petitions may be a result of the accommodations put forward by the Senate/Senate Executive during the CUPE 3903 labour disruption.

The Faculty of Health Petitions Committee saw minimal movement in requests for deferred standing/extension of deferred standing in 2023-2024, with an overall decrease of 1 (equivalent to 1.6% decrease) compared to 2022-2023.

As was predicted in the previous report, the petition submission levels have started to re-align with pre-pandemic statistics, with some impact due to the CUPE 3903 labour disruption in the Winter 2024 term. With the return to regular operating procedures at York University, exceptional increases and decreases to petition types by term were less common and the trends seem to be consistent.

Review of Applications for Tenure and Promotions September 2023 – June 2024:

During the 2023-2024 academic year members met 6 times to consider 22 applications for tenure and/or promotion and 2 applications for promotion to Full Professor. There are currently 2 outstanding files from 2023-2024 still pending review.

Update on the status of Unit-Specific Tenure and Promotion Standards:

Unit-specific tenure and promotion standards remain at varying levels of revision and approval. As of September 2024, the status of unit-specific standards for each of the Faculty of Health units is as follows:

Department of Psychology

- Unit Standards for full Professor were reviewed by Senate and returned to the Unit for review.
- Unit Standards for Associate Professor Teaching Stream were reviewed by Senate and retuned to the Unit for review. They have been re-submitted to Senate for final review and approval.
- Unit Standards for full Professor, Teaching Stream not submitted for review.

School of Kinesiology and Health Science

All Unit standards have been submitted, reviewed and are In Accord.

School of Nursing

- Unit Standards for full Professor were reviewed by Senate and returned to the Unit for review. They have since been re-submitted to Senate for final review and approval.
- Unit Standards for Associate and full Professor, Teaching Stream not submitted for review.

School of Health Policy and Management

 Unit Standards for Associate and full Professor, Teaching Stream not submitted for review
