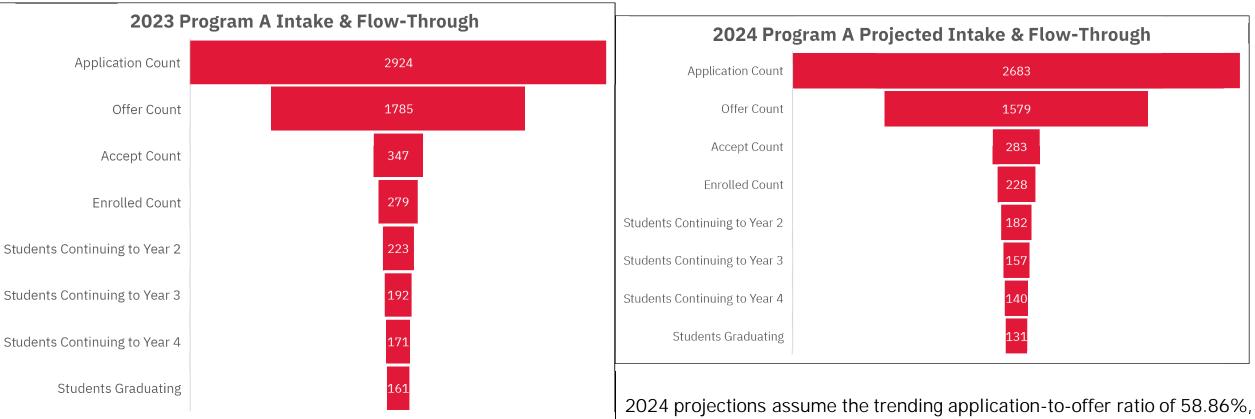

Values are based on an 8.24% decline in applications compared to 2023



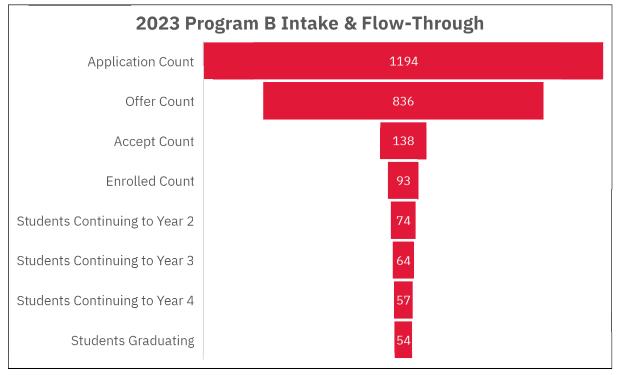
2024 projections assume the trending application-to-offer ratio of 58.86%, offer-to-accept ratio of 17.95%, and accept-to-enrolled ratio of 80.4%.

All values are based on 2023 program data from Insight and Retention Dashboard. Ratios of application-to-offer, offer-toaccept, and accept-to-enrolled are 61.05%, 19.44%, and 80.4%, respectively. Faculty-wide retention rates are 80% after Year 1, 86% after Year 2, 89% after Year 3, and 94% after Year 4. Potential Impacts:

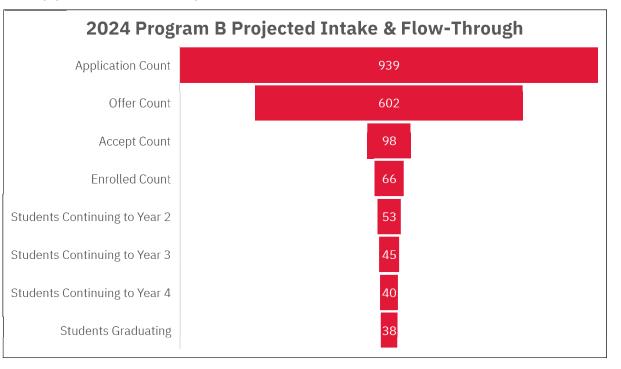
- 51 fewer new students enrolled (~408 fewer seats in 3.0 courses)
- 41 fewer students continuing to year 2 (~328 fewer seats in 3.0 courses)
- 35 fewer students continuing to year 3 (~280 fewer seats in 3.0 courses)
- 31 fewer students continuing to year 4 (~248 fewer seats in 3.0 courses)

Program B Flow-Through Effect: 2023 vs 2024 Scenarios

Values are based on a 21.43% decline in applications compared to 2023



All values are based on 2023 program data from Insight and Retention Dashboard. Ratios of application-to-offer, offer-to-accept, and acceptto-enrolled 70.02%, 16.51%, and 67.39% respectively. Faculty-wide retention rates are 80% after Year 1, 86% after Year 2, 89% after Year 3, and 94% after Year 4.

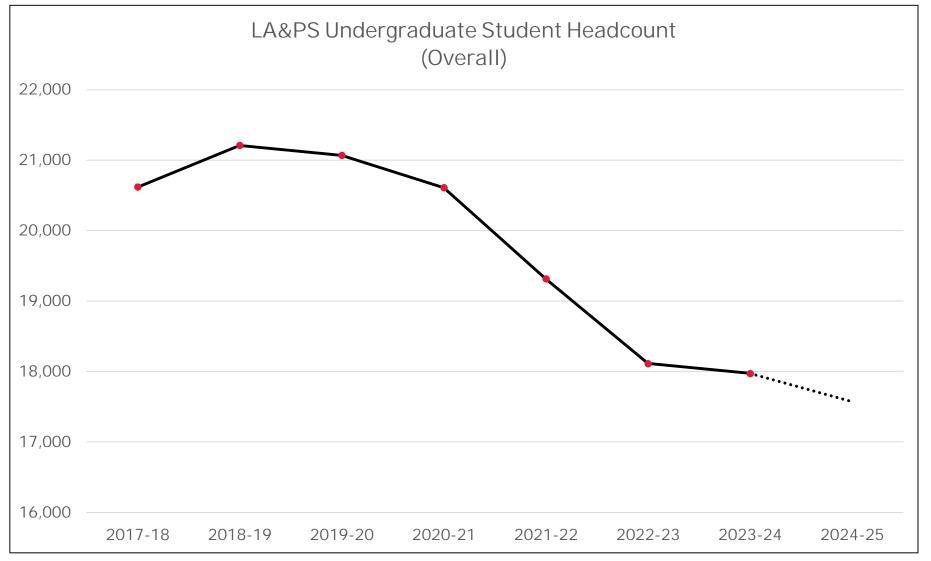


2024 projections assume trending application-to-offer ratio of 64.11%, offer-to-accept ratio of 16.23%, and accept-to-enrolled ratio of 67.39%.

Potential Impacts

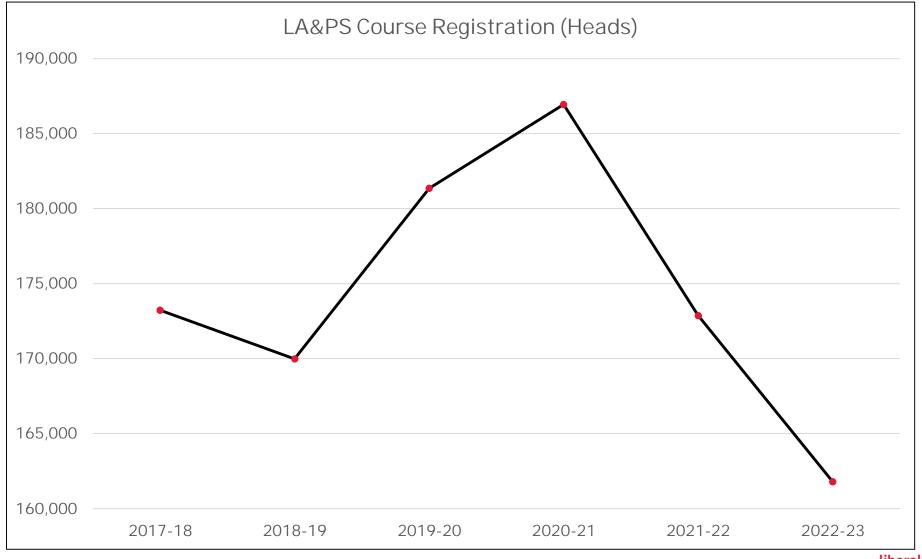
- 27 fewer new students enrolled (~216 fewer seats in 3.0 courses)
- 21 fewer students continuing to year 2 (~168 fewer seats in 3.0 courses)
- 19 fewer students continuing to year 3 (~152 fewer seats in 3.0 courses)
- 17 fewer students continuing to year 4 (~136 fewer seats in 3.0 courses)

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Enrolment Challenges, Fall 2024

- 20,000+ fewer seats required from high point of 2020-21
- Loss of ~168 heads (1,344 x 3.0 credit seats) from Lassonde switch offers
- Pending loss of switch offers from Schulich
- Loss of ~500+ course enrolments in ECON 1000 & ECON 1010 from Schulich
- Loss of ~2,000+ course enrolments in SOSC GenEds from Health
- Loss of 430 course enrolments in GenEds from AMPD

Recruitment Challenges, Fall 2024

- International study permit cap from 2024-2026
- Increased competition for domestic and international students due to declining applications
- Negative stories about YorkU in the news
- Fall-out from strike lasting for three years with an average impact of 8% decline in acceptances

LA&PS Budget 2024/25 – Cost Reduction Plans

- > Of the \$11.5M savings requested, we are close to achieving \$7.3M as follows:
 - Course Savings: \$3.3M
 - Support Staff: \$2.0M
 - Operating: \$2.0M
- > Salaries
 - Teaching: Reduced Complement renewal, courses with low fill rates and multiple sections, under-enrolled courses, adjust course offering according to projected enrolments, etc.
 - Support Staff: Hiring Freeze
- > Operations
 - Paused Renovations and Deferred Maintenance
 - Equipment purchases at minimum
 - Hospitality at minimum (student recruitment and retention focused events). Low per person cost
 - Paused all Professional Development for Support Staff (CPM / YUSA)
 - Minor Research Grants at minimum
 - Paused some scholarships or used funds in Trust / Endowments
