**Purpose of the Research:** The Canadian Identities/Les identités canadienne -- une interrogation (ICI) Partnership Development Grant will interrogate anachronistic and persistent images and ideas about Canadian identity that date back to 1967 and the celebration of Canada's hundredth anniversary. These conceptions, however, are often rooted in the historical conceptions of settler communities and this country's first one hundred and fifty-five years. We are interested in the continued impact of that past on contemporary views of what it means to be a Canadian now.

Our objectives are to examine:

- (a) what images of being Canadian are being presented today in these different media and whether they have evolved since 1965;
- (b) whether media policy should continue to have a nation-building mandate;
- (c) and if so, what images of being Canadian should underpin media policy in an era of Black Lives Matter and the Truth Reconciliation Commission; and
- (d) how these images are received and contextualized by lived experiences of Canadians.

## What You Will Be Asked to Do in the Research:

While the interviews are not directly a part of the research, we will be conducting interviews with interested participants for the regularly produced podcasts, as part of the Canadian Identities/Les identités canadienne -- une interrogation (ICI) research project. Interviews will be twenty minutes to an hour.

Risks and Discomforts: Although we do not foresee any risks or discomfort from your participation in the research, there may be minor risks of psychological or emotional discomfort that may result from participation. Risks are minimal. Additionally, there are some possible social risks such as a loss of confidentiality if anonymity is being waived. If any discomfort occurs due to these risks, participants may choose to stop participating at any time.

## Benefits of the Research and Benefits to You:

This research will give all the participants a chance to contribute to research about Canadian identities and living Canada They will have a chance to make their opinion known and learn what others think.

**Voluntary Participation and Withdrawal**: Your participation in the study is completely voluntary and you may choose to stop participating at any time. Your decision not to volunteer, to stop participating, or to refuse to answer particular questions will not influence the nature of your relationship with York University either now, or in the future. Should you wish to withdraw after the study, you will have the option to also withdraw your data up until the analysis is complete.

Confidentiality: These interviews will be podcasted, so there will be no confidentiality because the guests will be introduced during the podcast.

Recordings (audio) will be saved in a password protected file to research team members' local computer, not the cloud-based service.
