York University's Multidisciplinary Undergraduate Research Fair

The website is now open to receive applications for **York** University's 5th Annual Multidisciplinary Undergraduate Research Fair, taking place March 1, 2017. The juried Research Fair is an excellent opportunity for undergrads to share their work in a friendly, cross-curricular environment, by way of simultaneously presented poster sessions. Applications are based on a project completed for a York credit course in 2016. Students wishing to present an academic poster apply by submitting a graded, researchbased project or honours thesis, prepared between January and December 2016, along with a 250-word abstract. A workshop on designing and presenting an academic poster will be offered to participating students, and the posters are printed at no cost to presenters. Monetary prizes will be awarded, and all Fair participants will receive an invitation to submit a new article on their project, to be considered for publication in the refereed e-journal Revue YOUR Review, sponsored by York University Libraries. Undergraduate students who have created a piece of art or design work for a 2016 York credit course may apply to have their work displayed in the Scott Library *Art Walk*. One artwork submission will be chosen for the cover of the e-journal.

3rd Annual OGRA Emerging Municipal Leaders Forum 2017


