Senior Policy and Program Advisor — Ontario Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism

This position is part of the Anti-Racism Directorate and plays a pivotal role in identifying, addressing, and preventing systemic racism in Ontario. The Advisor will lead the development, implementation, and evaluation of policies and programs aligned with provincial anti-racism strategies. They will engage with key stakeholders and partners, providing strategic input to ministry staff and guiding the creation of impactful anti-racism policies and programs. Additionally, they will develop and implement robust program analysis and evaluation frameworks to assess and enhance the government's progress in advancing racial equity.

This role is essential for readying the organization to become a nuclear licensee, while conducting, procuring, and overseeing APM activities in a way that satisfies CSA N286-12 and related regulatory requirements. The incumbent is expected to have excellent verbal and written communication, cross-organizational collaboration, and change leadership skills, as well as practical understanding of a broad range of nuclear and conventional quality assurance standards and their graded implementation.

Project Officer/Engineer – Nuclear Waste Management Organization

Reporting to the Director, Site Characterization and working collaboratively across other departments and disciplines, the incumbent will provide project management expertise and be responsible for ensuring the delivery and coordination of the technical aspects of the deliverables of the Site Characterization Project, this will include data and reports associated with Geoscientific and environmental field and laboratory studies. The incumbent will develop, plan, schedule, and manage a work program to ensure the delivery of the Site Characterization Projects deliverables (data and reports) to project clients at the agreed quality and timeline.

Senior Policy Advisor — Ontario Ministry of Colleges and Universities
