Requirement Checklist and Notes

(To ensure graduation, each box much be checked as completed.)

- □ Residency Requirement: A minimum of 30 course credits and at least half (50 percent) of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program major/minor must be taken at York University.
- □ Upper-level Requirement: at least 36 credits at the 3000-4000 level. 18 credits must be at the 4000 level
- □ Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 5.0.

NOTE: For the <u>general education</u> category, students must take 21 credits of general education including: 6.00 credits in natural science (NATS); A 9.00 credit approved general education course in the social science or humanities categories; and a 6.00 credit approved general education course in the opposite category to the 9.00 credit course in the social science or humanities already taken. General Education courses are offered at the 1000 level.
