<sup>2</sup> Demonstrated competence in an East Asian language (usually Chinese, Japanese, or Korean) at the intermediate level is required. This requirement will normally be met by successful completion of AP/CH 2000 6.00 or AP/JP 2000 6.00 or AP/KOR 2000 6.00.

<sup>3</sup> At least 12 credits (other than language/translation courses) at the 4000 level

## Requirement Checklist and Notes

(To ensure graduation, each box must be checked as completed.)

- Residency Requirement: A minimum of 30 course credits and at least half (50 percent) of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program major/minor must be taken at York University.
- Upper-level Requirement: At least 36 credits at the 3000-level or above and at least 18 credits must be taken at 4000-level.
- Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 5.0.

NOTE: For the [general education](#) category, students must take 21 credits of general education including: 6.00 credits in natural science (NATS); A 9.00 credit approved general education course in the social science or humanities categories; and a 6.00 credit approved general education course in the opposite category to the 9.00 credit course in the social science or humanities already taken. General Education courses are offered at the 1000 level.
