¹All students majoring or minoring in English must complete the following introductory course/s before proceeding in English: EN 1001 3.0 and Ap/EN 1002 3.0 OR AP/EN 1101 6.0 OR AP/EN 1102 6.0 OR AP/EN 1103 6.0. Students must successfully complete AP/EN 1001 3.0 with a minimum grade of D (50%) before they may take AP/EN 1002 3.0 and complete AP/EN 1002 3.0 with a minimum grade of C (60%) before they will be permitted to continue in English. AP/EN 1101, EN 1102 or EN 1103 must be completed with a minimum grade of C to continue with English as a major/minor. Students may only count six credits from a 1000-level English course towards their major or minor program.

Note: Students may not count more than six credits from the 2170 and 3170 series of AP/EN courses (the Popular Genres series) for major or minor credit in English.

Honours BAs, Honours Double Major BAs, or Honours Double Major Interdisciplinary BAs, or Honours Major/Minor BAs, students pursuing those degrees must take at least three credits in courses from Time period group I and at least three credits in courses from Time period group II (refer to English Department's website re: Time period requirements)

Additional Notes:

Requirement Checklist and Notes (To ensure graduation, each box must be checked 'completed')

- Residency Requirement: a minimum of 30 course credits and at least half (50 per cent) of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program major/minor must be taken at York University.
- Upper-level Requirement: at least 36 credits at the 3000 or 4000 level, including 18 credits at 4000-level.
- Cumulative grade point average of at least 5.0.

NOTE#1: Non-Literature Courses: students cannot use uncategorized EN courses toward their major requirements: these include, but are not limited to, courses offered in the subjects PRWR, CRWR and DLLL

NOTE#2: Popular Genre Course: students may count up to a maximum of 6 credits from Category D (Popular Genres: EN 3170-3179) towards their major requirements

NOTE: For the [general education](#) category, students must take 21 credits of general education including: 6.00 credits in natural science (NATS); A 9.00 credit approved general education course in the social science or humanities categories; and a 6.00 credit approved general education course in the opposite category to the 9.00 credit course in the social science or humanities already taken. General Education courses are offered at the 1000 level.
