(To ensure graduation, each box must be checked as completed.)

- Residency Requirement: A minimum of 30 course credits and at least half (50 percent) of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program major/minor must be taken at York University.
- Upper-level Requirement: At least 36 credits must be at the 3000 or 4000-level, and at least 18 credits must be at the 4000 level
- Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 5.0.

General Education courses are offered at the 1000 level.
