


Purpose

Vaccination by neighbourhood - percentage vaccinated






North West neighbourhoods home to many immigrants, e.g., 63% in York University Heights.

- Policy failures



Vaccination by Neighbourhood and Age




Share of COVID-19 cases among ethno-racial groups compared to the share of people living in Toronto, with valid data up to July 16, 2020 (N=3,861)






