The York Region Network has received funding approval for the project "Migration and Resilience in York Region: Supporting Flexible Information Access Across Multiple Communities". The team is currently seeking ethics approval. Additional information has been received from stakeholders to inform community outreach strategies.



# The Toronto City Network

A small group of Toronto City Network members met in January to brainstorm sampling method ideas for a policy analysis of "resilience" in Ontario provincial and City of Toronto municipal policies. As part of the policy analysis research, a timeline info-graphic was developed on the changing relationship between the federal government and the

Ontario government on immigration and settlement related matters since the early 1990s, and a literature review is currently being completed. You can consult the info-graphic <u>here</u>.



# The Kitchener-Waterloo City Network

The City Network met on February 7th to plan their recruitment strategies for focus groups and Key Informant Interviews. The team divided roles based on the migration categories researched. The group is now waiting for REB approval. In the meantime, the city network is in the process of brainstorming on key informants within the Region of Waterloo and on recruitment strategies for each of the migration categories studies. The

team aims to have focus groups and key informant interviews started by March.



# **The Windsor City Network**

The Windsor City Network had a demonstration performance by the high school migrant youth involved in the Drama as a Second Language initiative. The team is currently collecting post program data, and expanding to a post-secondary initiative involving university students.

# Postdoctoral fellowship opportunity

Dr. Antoine Bilodeau and Dr. Mireille Paquet are seeking one (1) postdoctoral fellow to contribute to a new project on the social, political, cultural and economic participation of immigrants and minorities in Quebec. Quantitative in nature, the project will focus on local scales and seek to test a model on the contextual determinants of immigrant participation.
