I am also very pleased to announce that hiring for the Knowledge Mobilization Officer is coming to a successful conclusion. We have made the offer. As soon as the letter is signed and returned, I will share information about the new staff member.

We owe tremendous thanks to Jane Wedlock from UWTYR and Brian Ray from University of Ottawa who served on the hiring committee along with Krista Jensen from the York University KMb Unit and the HR Staff in the Office of the Vice President Research and Innovation. This is also the moment to thank Raymond Hyma who has been acting as our knowledge broker on a part-time basis. In addition to helping us design a logo, an acronym, and the website, Raymond has also prepared a draft KM plan that will help his successor get going immediately. He also worked with the designer and academic partners to prepare the template for the *Research Digests*, the first three research summaries, and a template for bios that will be published on the website. He has been terrific.

And yes, once again, I am going to say that the website is almost ready. Much of the initial material is translated so we hope you will receive an email soon announcing its location.

Steering Committee News

The Steering Committee met on June 8 and 9 for a Strategy Planning Meeting at York University (Keele Campus), Toronto. The meeting was very well attended with about 35 people on Thursday participating in the discussion of research priorities and a smaller group of about 16 working on an implementation plan on Friday. I want to thank all of the participants for their contributions. I know everyone is very busy so it was great to see all of you working so hard and so effectively.

I am still working through the lengthy notes of the meeting. Since there just hasn't been time to summarize them, the summary will be sent later in July. I can say that the Strategy Planning Meeting was very productive:

- Six major research projects were outlined. They are at different stages of development but it looks as if at least three will begin this summer.
- A process and schedule for commenting on proposed research and finalizing financial allocations was determined,
- Interest in a longitudinal analysis of migrant resilience was expressed, and
- Several issues around governance and finances were resolved.

Executive Committee News

On behalf of everyone on the Executive Committee and in the partnership, I want to thank Clarence Lochhead for his contributions to the committee and the partnership. He has offered much wise counsel and guidance. Clarence is leaving Hire Immigrants Ottawa and I know everyone joins me in wishing him all the best in his future endeavours. We welcome Henry Akanko from Hire Immigrants Ottawa who has agreed to replace Clarence on the Executive Committee.

Stephan Reichold from TCRI has also agreed to serve on the Executive Committee. With Stephan's addition, the Executive Committee now includes an academic and a non-

academic partner from Ontario and an academic and a non-academic partner from Quebec, as we originally proposed.

City Network News

All City Networks were represented at the Strategy Planning Meeting of the BMRC–IRMU Steering Committee that was held on June 8–9, 2017 at York University, Toronto. The event was attended by many officials including, among others, Kathleen Weil, Minister of Immigration, Diversity and Inclusiveness, and Denise Otis of the Montreal HCR. Ottawa–Gatineau

The network is convening a community meeting in July with the objective to follow up on the June Strategy Planning Meeting of the Steering Committee and discuss the research projects that the network wishes to initiate.

York Region

The network met on June 13 to review the feedback from the community consultations that were conducted on the United Way Concept Paper and the projects that are evolving at the other networks. It was decided that the network needed to reflect on the community agencies' input and would develop a one-page summary of the feedback to reconnect with the community agencies over the summer.

The network is continuing its project development work.

Kitchener-Waterloo

Windsor

Having secured research ethics approval from the University of Windsor, the network is about to start data collection for a study of the experiences of international students.
