

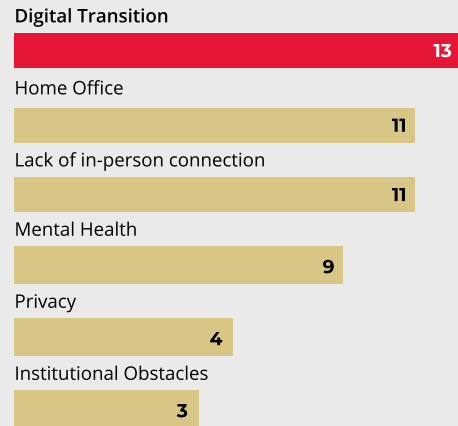
COVID-19 & PUNJABI MIGRATION PROJECT

INITIAL RESEARCH FINDINGS WITH SETTLEMENT WORKERS

We conducted **interviews with 18 settlement workers**, including community health providers, employment counsellors and community leaders, and asked them about **their experiences of working with Punjabi newcomers** in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) before and during the pandemic.

THE COVID-19 & PUNJABI MIGRATION project's goals are to understand the shifting needs, obstacles, concerns and coping strategies around settlement among young newcomer Punjabis (ages 18–35) in the GTA in the context of COVID-19.

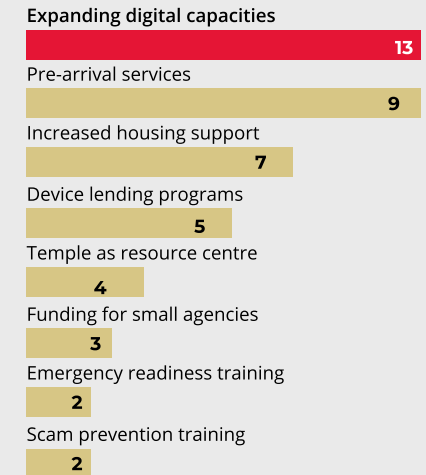
SETTLEMENT WORKERS' PERSONAL CHALLENGES



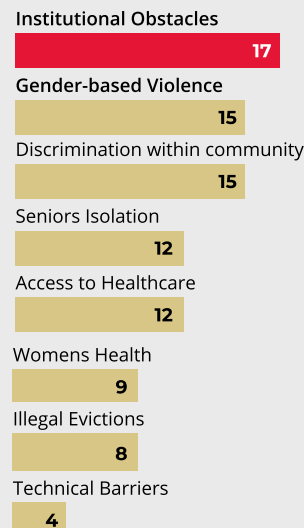
SETTLEMENT WORKERS' PERSONAL STRATEGIES



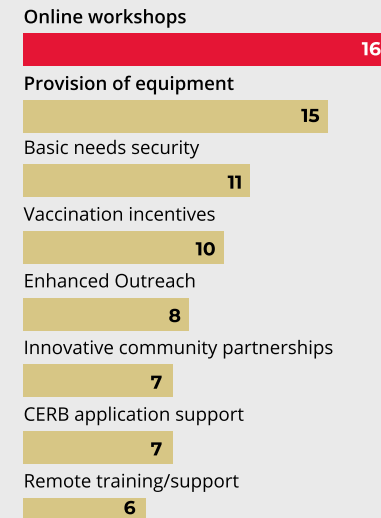
