York University is moving forward with plans to establish a new School of Medicine. *The Senate Academic Policy, Planning & Research Committee* has been engaged in planning for the development of the academic components of the new school. Before proceeding with a recommendation that Senate *approve in principle* the establishment of a school of medicine - a step that would activate normal processes leading to the review and approval of a statutory motion - APPRC believes it is important to share information with the York community about this complex and multi-faceted initiative and the planning processes that will guide it. The Senate committee also wants to hear from the collegium on issues that should be addressed, particularly at this early stage of planning.
