Practical AI: Rethinking the Spectrum of Academic Integrity (ONLINE ~ July 12, 2024, 11:30-12:30)

In this series of 1-hour webinars from June through September, we will use each session to explore one topic related to teaching and learning in a time of Generative Artificial Intelligence (GenAI) and develop one strategy or tool to integrate into your courses.

In July, we explore Matt Miller's approach to cheating as a spectrum, with discussion of where and how we might each draw the line in our specific course contexts. By the end of this session, participants will be able to distinguish the acceptable use of GenAI from the unacceptable, tailored to the specific learning goals and assessment strategies of their courses.
