Important Vaccines

- Shingles
- Covid boosters
- Flu this year
- RSV vaccine
- Pneumococcal pneumonia

Shingles

- If you have had chickpox, you can get shingles (Herpes Zoster)
- Old vaccine Zostavax®; current vaccine Shingrix® 2-dose injection
- Shingrix® funded for 65-70 group since 2020
- Until Dec 31, 2023, group born 1949-52 also included unless you had Zostavax[®] covered by OHIP
 - Must be completed by Dec 31, and doses are 2-6 mo apart so do not delay!!!!
- You can pay for it if you aren't eligible

COVID

- Uptick starting in US where schools opened earlier than Canada; numbers increasing in Canada now too
- NEVER really went away for older people
- COVID a dangerous disease of older people
 - About 85% of total deaths in Canada from covid were in over 65 yr group
 - About 75% of total deaths in USA from covid were in over 65 yr group

COVID vaccine update

- Most widespread strain EG5 (Eris) Omicron descendent XBB.1.9.2
- New strain of concern BA.2.86 (Pirola) many mutations
- Vaccine for this fall:
 - Target: XBB.1.5
 - Status:
 - FDA has approved both Moderna and Pfizer versions for USA
 - Health Canada: approved Moderna Sept 12, 2023. Pfizer under review.
- Both previous vaccinations and having covid increase your immunity, but 6
 month interval viewed as time for booster this fall
- Only apprx 20% of Canadians >65yr have had covid shots in past 6 mo

Flu, RSV and pneumonia

- Flu outlook based on southern hemisphere should be available in October for 60+ group
 - Fluzone® High Dose (IIV4-HD) authorized for adults 65 years of age and older.
 - 2 Influenza-A (H1N1 & H3N2) & 2 Influenza-B
- RSV Respiratory syncytial virus
 - Arexvy® (GSK) vaccine approved this year by Health Canada for individuals 60+
 - No information yet about where and when it will be available longterm care will be first priority
- Pneumococcal Pneumonia Vaccines

In Ontario:

- PPSV23 (Pneumovax®23) is publicly funded (free) for adults ages 65+*.
- PCV13 (Prevnar®13) may be purchased on an individual basis for seniors 65+*.
